History and Organization

The Office of the Prosecutor Coordinator (PCO) was created under Act 925 of 1975. The Prosecution Coordination Commission, a seven-member board chosen by all elected prosecuting attorneys, sets the overall policy of the Coordinator's office. The mission statement for PCO is to *improve the criminal justice system by promoting professionalism in the offices of Arkansas Prosecuting Attorneys and Victim Service Providers through education, information, liaison, and advocacy.* The Office provides a broad range of technical assistance and support services for prosecuting attorneys, their deputies, and crime victim service providers. The support services include:

LEGAL RESEARCH - Upon request, the staff prepares extensive trial briefs, legal memoranda, county government opinions, sample ordinances, and basic litigation forms. Emergency assistance during a trial is a special service. The research center is especially important to deputies in rural areas who do not have ready access to a law library. In addition, PCO staff attorneys may serve as special deputy prosecuting attorneys' as needed.

CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION - PCO sponsors continuing legal education seminars for prosecutors, deputies, victim/witness coordinators, hot check coordinators, law enforcement, and other support staff.

LENDING LIBRARY - A lending library of educational materials, e.g., books, videotapes, and audiocassettes is maintained.

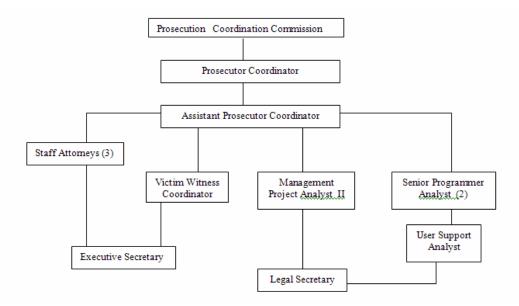
PUBLICATIONS - Newsletters capsuling the latest appellate court opinions and other information are distributed as follows: <u>APAA Newsletter</u> to members of the Prosecuting Attorneys' Association; <u>Crackdown</u> to drug prosecutors and narcotics officers; and <u>Advocates in Action</u> to victim services providers. Training manuals on a variety of subject matters have been developed and supplemented on an as needed basis.

CIVIL COMMITMENTS - Pursuant to Act 861 of 1989, Act 10 of the Third Extraordinary Session of 1989, and Act 911 of 1989, PCO is responsible for representing the State in all civil and criminal commitment hearings held on the State Hospital grounds. PCO participated in approximately 2,635 hearings during 2001-2002.

VICTIM/WITNESS SUPPORT - A victim/witness coordinator position at PCO was established by Act 408 of 1985 to provide training and technical assistance to victim service providers and crime victims. There are currently victim assistance programs in all 28 judicial districts. Some of these districts have

programs in multiple counties.

COMPUTERS - The Office of the Prosecutor Coordinator has developed programs to automate functions within the Prosecuting Attorneys' Offices. The Hot Check System handles hot check offenses which have resulted in millions of dollars in collected restitution for merchants. PCO has implemented a new case management system for tracking defendants, victims, witnesses and trial information to aid prosecutors, case coordinators and victim witness coordinators in handling cases.



Agency Commentary

RENT - The Office of Prosecutor Coordinator is requesting \$1,934 for office space for the first year of the biennium to provide for a 4% increase in rent charged by the Catlett-Prien Firm, bringing the rate up from \$11.24 to \$11.86 per square foot, and \$2,554 for the second year of the biennium to provide for an anticipated 5% increase, bringing the rate up from \$11.86 per square foot to \$12.46.

TECHNOLOGY - The Office of Prosecutor Coordinator requests additional funding the first year of the biennium to replace our current servers and tape backup autoloader purchased in 1999 and to replace two computers. This equipment replacement is not only vital for our office's critical data backup but with the emergence of virtual private networking, we are now able to backup critical data at remote Prosecuting Attorneys' offices. This additional funding will also be used to improve and manage our automated case management and automated hot check systems which are key elements in the State Integrated Justice System.

RECLASSIFICATION - This reclassification from a grade 21, Senior Programmer Analyst to a grade 24, Information Systems Administrator is being requested by the Office of the Prosecutor Coordinator based on the following: 1) The current Senior Programmer Analyst has over 16 years experience, six of which has been served in the Office of Prosecutor Coordinator. 2) This individual supervises a three person staff serving as liaisons to prosecuting attorneys and their staffs which operate either the automated Hot Check Collection System and/or the Prosecution Coordination Commission Case Management System. 3) This position serves as a technical adviser to the State of Arkansas'

Integrated Justice Pilot Project in Faulkner County. 4) This increase will allow for continuity in the position, and will also make the position competitive with applicable positions in other state and federal agencies as well as in the private sector.

EXTRAORDINARY SALARY INCREASE - This increase is requested by the Prosecution Coordination Commission and is based on the following facts: 1) The current Prosecutor Coordinator has eighteen years legal experience, sixteen years in the Office of Prosecutor Coordinator. 2) This individual is responsible for management of a twelve staff member state office as well as serving as liaison to Prosecuting Attorneys and their staff in all 28 Judicial Districts of the state. 3) This increase will allow for continuity in the position, and will also make the position competitive with applicable positions in other state and federal agencies as well as in the private sector.

Analysis of Budget Request

Appropriation / Program: 065 - Law Enforcement & Prosecutorial Programs **Funding Sources:** MDT-Law Enforcement & Prosecutorial Programs

The Office of Prosecutor Coordinator requests Base Level of \$ 72,000 each year of the 2006-2007 biennium for the Law Enforcement and Prosecutorial Programs appropriation. This program is funded from a portion of those funds remitted by the cities and counties from court costs and filing fees for deposit into the State Administration of Justice Fund. A share of those funds collected is then allocated to the Office of Prosecutor Coordinator for deposit in the Law Enforcement and Prosecutor Drug Enforcement Training Fund per Arkansas Code Annotated §16-10-310. Funds are used solely for law enforcement and prosecutorial purposes.

The Executive Recommendation provides for the Agency Request.

Analysis of Budget Request

Appropriation / Program: 090 - Prosecutor Coordinator Operations **Funding Sources:** HSC-Prosecutor Coordinator Operations

This appropriation represents the main operating appropriation used by the Office of Prosecutor Coordinator in meeting costs associated with fulfilling the essential mission of the Agency. This appropriation is funded from the State Central Services Fund. The Base Level for this agency is \$772,539 in FY06 and \$790,565 in FY07. Of the total Agency Request for this appropriation, Change Level Requests totals \$ 28,874 for FY2006 and \$ 14,912 for FY 2007.

The Office of Prosecutor Coordinator requests that the Prosecutor Coordinator's FY2005 salary level of \$ 75,751 be increased bringing the salary level to \$ 84,800. A standard 3.0% increase above the requested level for FY06 is then requested for FY07, bringing the salary level to \$ 87,089. This increase is requested to make this position's salary competitive with comparable positions in the private sector as well as an effort to recognize the incumbent's qualifications and experience. The Agency would like to re-class one Sr. Programmer/Analyst grade 22 to an Information Systems Administrator grade 24.

Base Level for this appropriation includes a graduated salary increase of 3.0% to 1.5% each year over the FY05 salary levels, along with related Personal Services Matching costs for 12 Base Level positions. This includes a \$600 minimum increase for employees earning \$20,000 or below. Included in Personal Services Matching is a \$40 per month increase in the monthly contribution for State employee's health insurance for a total state contribution of \$320 per month per budgeted employee.

In Regular Operating Expenses, \$ 1,934 for FY06 & FY07 is requested as a result of an anticipated four percent (4%) increase in office space rent expense.

In Technology Operating Expenses, \$15,000 is requested in FY06 for additional computers, servers and software.

The Executive Recommendation provides for the Agency Request except it does not recommend the Extraordinary Salary increase for the Prosecutor Coordinator grade 99 position.
