

Enabling Laws

Act 100 of 2003 ACA 17-96-101 et. seq.

History and Organization

The Arkansas Board of Podiatric Medicine, authorized by ACA 17-96-101 et seq., licenses and regulates the practice of podiatry in the State. The Board is composed of five Governor appointed members who serve three year terms. The Board is funded from Cash funds from license and examination fees used for operating expenses. Act 100 of 2003 provides for the Board's 2003-2005 biennial operations. The Board has the power, after a hearing pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act, to revoke the certificate and cancel the registration of any person who is found guilty of violation the rules and regulations of the Board.



Agency Commentary

Created by Act 610 of 1923, the Arkansas State Podiatry Examining Board regulates the practice of podiatry in the State. Act 966 of 1997 amended Arkansas Code §17-96-202 and changed the name to Arkansas Board of Podiatric Medicine. This Board is a Cash Agency funded from examination fees and licensing fees charged pursuant to subchapter 3 of Arkansas Code Annotated §17-96.
