ARKANSAS BUDGET SYSTEM AGENCY PROGRAM COMMENTARY 1999 - 2001

The Sentencing Commission is in a unique position to offer quality data analysis of criminal justice laws, policies and practices from a neutral viewpoint. Whereas the major correctional agencies have massive budgets and internal information services to serve their own needs, the Sentencing Commission, representing the court room practitioners can review the data obtained from the Department of Correction, the Department of Community Punishment, and the Administrative Office of the Courts from a neutral "criminal justice systems" viewpoint, i.e., the overall picture from the courtroom to the state agency. It is then charged with presenting this information to the Governor, the legislature, the Judicial Council and the public.

There are three major data bases involved in the system, those of the Department of Correction, Department of Community Punishment, and the Administrative Office of the Courts. In order for the Sentencing Commission to make accurate prison population projections and to track the impact which current and new laws may have on the criminal justice system, it must be able to analyze the enormous amounts of data provided by these three systems. This information is vital in planning for the best use of corrections resources. Currently the Sentencing Commission has only one research position. This researcher deals primarily with Department of Correction and Administrative Office of the Courts data. The Department of Community Punishment plans to bring their information system on line the summer of 1998. The current prison population software designed for Arkansas can be modified to also project probation and parole populations and to analyze the need for intermediate sanction programming under the Department of Community Punishment. All agencies are aware of the need to coordinate these databases, which are currently incompatible. Increased federal funding is available under the Federal Crime Act for numerous programs which require quality data analysis in the grant applications. By adding one research position to the Arkansas Sentencing Commission the following goals would be served: 1) better analysis of correctional programming and its connection to local practices, 2) better planning and budgeting for the correctional agencies, 3) increased grant applications, and 4) better coordination of system-wide information flow to support executive, legislative and judicial decisions. Improvement in any one of these areas would justify the expense of the position.

The research staff of the Arkansas Sentencing Commission should function as a research and development component of the criminal justice system as a whole. A minimum of two researchers who would coordinate their efforts with state agencies and state educational institutions would greatly benefit the system and the public which it is designed to protect and serve. Extra help positions have been available to the agency in the last biennium to improve the quality of the data gathered. New data elements are now available electronically and the need is for additional analysts. Therefore, this agency desires to redirect funding from extra help positions to one research position.

Quality data analysis depends upon quality data. In order to improve the timeliness and accuracy of data coming from the criminal justice system, the Sentencing Commission, the Administrative Office of the Courts, the Departments of Correction and Community Punishment, and the Arkansas Crime Information Center conduct training seminars in the various judicial districts of the State. The quality and effectiveness of this training depends on up-to-date information technology. The advent of Windows 95 technology and related software changes have made it necessary to update equipment needed for this training.

Dissemination of data to the public is one of the primary functions of this agency. An Internet home page is planned to aid in this endeavor. The sentencing standards would be available for downloading and answers to frequently asked questions would be more readily available. The site will be monitored and updated on a regular basis.

ARKANSAS BUDGET SYSTEM ANALYSIS OF BUDGET REQUEST 1999 - 2001

The Arkansas Sentencing Commission was established by Act 709 of 1993 for the purpose of instituting sentencing standards to ensure that sanctions imposed following conviction are proportional to the seriousness of the offense of conviction and the extent of the offender's criminal history. The Commission has developed the sentencing grid, the seriousness reference table and established transfer eligibility for all offenses. The Commission provides impact assessments on proposed legislation for the Governor and General Assembly through a professional services contract with the National Council on Crime and Delinquency (NCCD). This contract also has provided training to the staff of the Sentencing Commission and the Department of Correction in the use of a software program which is utilized in data analysis of criminal justice laws, policies and procedures.

This is the primary operating appropriation of the Commission. It is funded entirely by general revenue. Base Level includes a cost of living increase of 2.8% each year over the FY99 salary levels, related Personal Services Matching costs, as well as supporting Maintenance and General Operations.

Change Level Requests include:

- 1) An additional Agency Program Coordinator (Grade 21) is requested with associated operating costs for a total of \$38,814 in FY2000 and \$37,165 in FY2001. The position is needed primarily due to the additional workload that will result from the Department of Community Punishment data base becoming operational.
- 2) A reallocation of \$10,226 each year in Extra Help (\$9,000), Personal Services Matching (\$689) and Operating Expense (\$537), is requested to offset the cost of the additional position being requested.
- 3) Inflationary increases are requested in Operating Expenses (\$3,375 each year) for rent, advertising and replacement of code books; and Conference Fees and Travel (\$2,200 each year) to allow participation in national meetings and federal grant application activity.
- 4) An increase is requested in Capital Outlay (\$6,300 in FY2000 and \$2,500 in FY2001) and Operating Expenses (\$2,000 in each year) for new data processing equipment and changes in the inmate population and projection software.
- 5) Reclassification of an Executive Secretary (Grade 14) to an Administrative Assistant I (Grade 15) is requested at a cost of \$1,335 in FY2000 and \$1,373 in FY2001.

In addition to the Base Level Request, the Executive Recommendation provides for the following Change Level Requests:

- 1) An additional Agency Program Coordinator (Grade 21) is recommended with associated operating costs totaling \$38,814 in FY2000 and \$37,165 in FY2001.
- 2) A reallocation of resources currently authorized in Extra Help (\$9,000), Personal Services Matching (\$689) and Operating Expenses (\$537) is recommended to support the additional position.

The Executive Recommendation does not provide for the position reclassification.

Additional General Revenue funding of \$28,588 in FY2000 and \$26,939 in FY2001 is recommended for the Change Level recommendations.
