ARKANSAS BUDGET SYSTEM AGENCY PROGRAM COMMENTARY 1997 - 1999

The budget of the Arkansas Soybean Promotion Board for the 1997-99 biennium will be funded entirely by special revenues collected from an assessment on all soybeans produced in Arkansas. The assessment rate is one-half of one percent of the net market value for soybeans sold.

The budget request includes a very limited amount of funds for administrative and board-related expenses while most of the request is in categories that will allow funding of programs directly related to the objectives of the Board.

A priority request for Appropriation 026 is being made to allow for utilization of additional funds resulting from the discontinuation of refunds, improved commodity prices and increased crop yields. These additional special revenues will be used for increased expenditures in the program areas of research, promotion and market development with a base level request continued for necessary board and administrative expenses.

ARKANSAS BUDGET SYSTEM ANALYSIS OF BUDGET REQUEST

1997 - 1999

The Arkansas Soybean Board has requested a Base Level and Priority budget totaling \$3,696,000 each fiscal year. The requested priority for the Soybean Board would allow for appropriation authorization at a level necessary to provide for use of anticipated receipts for Research and Development. In the early 1990's, the Arkansas Soybean Board began participating in a program that allowed for encompassing the state's efforts in soybean programs into the national program of research and market development. Act 340 of 1991 authorized this change by replacing the State's funding of this Board (two cents per bushel) with a standardized assessment of .005% of the value of soybeans produced and sold in each participating state. The Board's funding finances soybean research and promotion activities through the United Soybeans Board and through programs within Arkansas.
