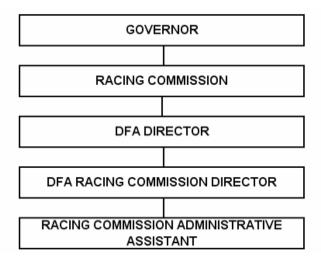

History and Organization

The mission of the Racing Commission is to regulate thoroughbred and greyhound racing in the State of Arkansas as provided in the enabling legislation; whereby, the best interests of the State and its citizens are preserved and protected.

Amendment 46 to the Arkansas Constitution authorizes horse and pari-mutual betting in Hot Springs. Act 46 of 1935 established the Arkansas Racing Commission. The Commission is composed of five members, one from each congressional district and one at large, appointed by the Governor for terms of five years. The Commission has the sole jurisdiction over thoroughbred horse and greyhound dog racing. Acts 339 of 1935 and 191 of 1957 stipulate the rules and regulations concerning greyhound racing. The Commission is authorized to grant franchises; approve racing dates; issue permits and licenses; hold hearings and take other action as necessary to supervise, regulate and effectively control the sport of racing in the State of Arkansas.



Agency Commentary

The Arkansas Racing Commission is composed of five members, one from each congressional district and one at large, appointed by the Governor for terms of five years. The Commission has sole jurisdiction over thoroughbred horse and greyhound dog racing. The Commission is authorized to grant franchises, approve racing dates, issue permits and licenses, hold hearings and take other action as necessary to effectively supervise, regulate and control the sport of racing in the State of Arkansas.

The Agency is requesting an increase of \$28,282 each year of the biennium in Extra Help Salaries and related Personal Services Matching to allow for a cola increase for employees at the horse and dog track. Special language is requested to increase the veterinarian salary at the dog track and if approved, Overtime Salaries will no longer be necessary to supplement the veterinarian salary therefore a reduction of \$10,000 in Overtime Salaries and related Personal Services Matching is requested.

Analysis of Budget Request

Appropriation / Program: 146 - Division of Racing - Operations **Funding Sources:** HUA - Miscellaneous Agencies Fund

This General Revenue funded appropriation provides for the operations of the Arkansas Racing Commission. The Arkansas Racing Commission is composed of five members, one from each congressional district and one at large, appointed by the Governor for terms of five years. The Commission is authorized to grant franchises, approve racing dates, issue permits and licenses, hold hearings and take other action as necessary to effectively supervise, regulate and control the sport of pari-mutuel horse and dog racing in the State of Arkansas.

The FY05 budgeted amount of \$1,022,614 consists of Regular Salaries and Personal Services Matching for two regular positions (DFA Racing Commission Manager - grade 24 and Management Project Analyst II - grade 20), 48 Extra Help positions, Overtime, Operating Expenses, Conference Fees and Travel, Capital Outlay and Professional Fees and Services.

Base Level request of \$1,044,637 for FY06 and \$1,048,698 for FY07 includes graduated salary increases of 3% to 1.5% each year over FY05 salary levels, along with related Personal Services Matching costs for two (2) Base Level positions. This includes a \$600 minimum increase for employees earning \$20,000 or below. Included in Personal Services Matching is a \$40 increase in the monthly contribution for State employee's health insurance for a total State match of \$320 per month.

The Agency is requesting an increase of \$33,599 each year of the biennium in Extra Help salaries and related Personal Services Matching. This increase will allow for graduated salary increases for employees at the horse and dog track. If the Special Language request to increase the veterinarian salary at the dog track is approved, overtime salaries will no longer be necessary to supplement the veterinarian salary therefore a reduction of \$11,880 is requested in Overtime Salaries and related Personal Services Matching. The net requested increase for the Agency is \$21,719 each year of the biennium.
