Enabling Laws

Act 454 of 2003 A.C.A. 12-9-101 et. seq.

History and Organization

As the dynamics of law enforcement continue to rapidly change, the Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training, recognizing its' responsibility to the citizens of our State by maintaining and enforcing standards for employment, is committed to providing the law enforcement profession in the State of Arkansas with the very best training available, utilizing the latest in law enforcement instructional methods, techniques, and technology, emphasizing professional ethics and personal accountability.

The Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy was established by the 1963 Arkansas General Assembly with the passage of Act 526. No funds were appropriated for the operation of the Academy at that time. For the next two years, concerned and interested law enforcement administrators worked diligently towards establishing an academy which would provide training to law enforcement officers in the State.

In 1965, Act 514 provided the necessary appropriations for the operations of the Academy. In that year also, Act 172 amended the act which originally created the Academy and placed it under the supervision and the direction of a board composed of three members appointed by the Governor.

Land which was owned by the United States Government and utilized as the Shumaker Ordinance Plant was converted to private enterprise by Brown & Root of Houston, Texas. It was decided that a portion of this land would be donated to the State Department of Education with the understanding that 13.6 acres would be used for a law enforcement training academy. As a result, the Academy was provided with permanent facilities at East Camden. The original structure, which is a part of the current facility, was formerly utilized as Bachelor Officers Quarters at the Naval Depot. It was modified and converted to provide food, lodging and training to law enforcement officers of the State.

The International Paper Company donated to the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy 56.9 acres adjoining the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy property in 1971. On August 26, 1986, 2.21 acres were donated to the Academy by Highland Resources Incorporated, formerly known as HRI Resources, Inc. This increased the total acreage to 72.71 acres, more or less.

The State of Arkansas purchased 28.68 acres adjoining the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy property in 1996, increasing the total acreage of the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy to a total of approximately 101.39 acres. This additional acreage was purchased for the purpose of the construction and operation of a Driving Training Course at the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy.

Class 68-A was the first class to be conducted in the East Camden facility. The three-week course was conducted January 28 - February 16 and was composed of thirty-four officers.

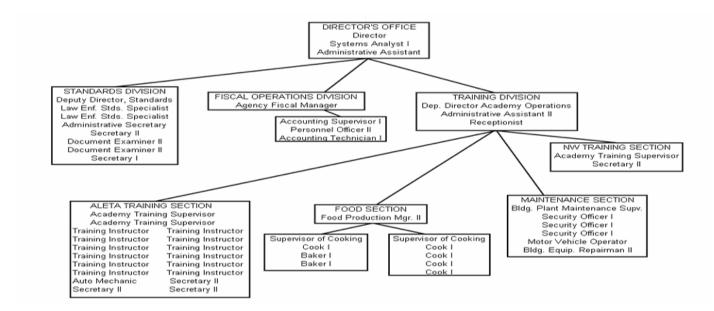
In the early 1970's it was realized the existing facilities were inadequate. Plans were made and approved for the construction of new facilities valued at 1.3 million dollars. This project was completed in March, 1976.

The Executive Commission on Law Enforcement Standards was created by House Bill 577 enacted by the Seventieth General Assembly, which was signed by Governor David Pryor on March 18, 1975 and became known as Act 452 of 1975, and later compiled as AR Statute Ann. 42-1001-1009, and presently Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated 12-9-101-12-9-109.

The Act granted the Executive Commission the power to establish reasonable minimum standards for selection and training of law enforcement officers in Arkansas, to certify officers as being qualified by training and education, to examine and evaluate instructors and courses of instruction and certify the extent of qualifications respectively.

The Commission was composed of five members appointed by the Governor to five-year terms, which were staggered. Act 452 requires the Commission to meet formally at least four times a year, adopt rules and regulations to govern its operations, select one of its members as Chairman and is authorized to enter in contracts or do such things as may be necessary and incidental to the administration of the Act. The Minimum Standards became effective January 1, 1978.

Act 45 of 1981 abolished the Department of Public Safety and transferred the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy from the agency to the newly created Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training, consisting eventually and presently of nine members. The same act abolished the Executive Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and transferred that agency to the Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training. The Act became effective July 1, 1981.



Agency Commentary

Due to the need to complete current projects, accomplish the mission, and meet the statutory requirements set for the Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training, it is imperative that the State of Arkansas makes a commitment to the law enforcement community. Properly funding the ongoing projects and maintaining the physical plant at the East Camden facility will accomplish this commitment.

The Drivers Training Course has the distinction of being the only half-completed course in the United States. As we struggle to maintain the equipment and provide basic drivers training, we cannot begin to provide training to the approximately 11,000 other law enforcement officers with no training in this area. The potential liability for failure to train in an activity they are involved in on a daily basis is tremendous, and could cost much more than the funds needed to finish the project and provide the equipment needed to implement it.

The North Dormitory of the ALETA Campus was constructed in 1952, along with the kitchen and administration section. These are completely dependent upon a boiler for heating, a chiller for cooling, and electrical system all installed when the building was constructed. The boiler room and all the plumbing that provides heated water to the radiators that heat the building are covered with asbestos. The chiller that cools the building regularly develops problems difficult to maintain and often quits during the hottest months of the year. Generally it takes (10) ten days to (2) two weeks to repair, resulting in extreme working and living conditions. The building has not been renovated since its construction.

A complete failure of the plumbing, electrical, heating, and cooling system, all over 50 years old, becomes more eminent with each passing year and would effectively close down half of this facility for an extended period of time. This will result in tremendous backlog of officers needing training.

The building structure is sound and renovation can be accomplished at less than half the cost of new construction. Renovation of the existing space using modern construction methods would increase bed space, reduce utility costs, and insure the continued operation of this facility. The request for renovation includes funding for asbestos abatement.

The increased M & O funds are essential in continuing our mission and statutory requirements of providing training and assistance to every city and county law enforcement agency as well as several state agencies. In a world continuing to evolve around the computer industry, law enforcement responsibilities in this area are ever increasing. Our Information Technology needs are extremely important to our operation and to the public throughout the state

This agency requests that 19 Clip Series positions be reclassified. It is vital to the operation of this agency that we be able to hire and retain quality employees.

The Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training continues to provide services to every city and county in the State with a smaller budget than a moderately sized police department.

Analysis of Budget Request

Appropriation / Program: 172 - Law Enforcement Standards-Oprs

Funding Sources: HUA - Miscellaneous Agencies Fund

This General Revenue appropriation provides for the operations of the Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training (CLEST). CLEST provides basic training for new officers and specialized training for certified police officers at the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy (ALETA) near East Camden and in Springdale, while providing field-training classes as requested around the state. CLEST and ALETA's goal is to establish the role of the law enforcement officer as a profession, thereby presenting the citizens of the State of Arkansas with officers who have the knowledge and skill to detect, prevent and reduce crime.

Base Level for this appropriation includes graduated salary increases of 3% to 1.5% each year over FY05 salary levels, along with related Personal Services Matching costs for fifty-four (54) Base Level positions. This includes a \$600 minimum increase for employees earning \$20,000 or below. Included in Personal Services Matching is a \$40 increase in the monthly contribution for State employee's health insurance for a total State match of \$320 per month.

The Change Level Requests include: Salary and Matching for the reclassification of two (2) positions for the promotions of eligible employees. Operating Expenses in the amount of \$295,340 for FY06 and \$290,033 for FY06 for needed repairs of the Camden dormitory, maintenance and operations of the Springdale campus, equipment for physical training and education of officers, and increases in firearms and ammunition for training. Overtime: \$6,000, each year of the biennium to be in compliance with the Fair Labor Standards Act, Travel - Conference Fees: \$1,500 each year, for projected additional training/travel related expenses, Professional Fees: \$65,500, for database expenses, Capital Outlay: \$338,300 in FY06 and \$223,300 in FY07 for ten (10) new training vehicles, upgrades to the Firearms Training Simulator and required modified pistols.

The Executive Recommendation provides \$6,000 in appropriation only of the Agency request for Overtime expenses. The Executive Recommendation also provides for \$69,965 each year of the biennium for Operating Expenses as well as \$100,000 in FY06 Capital Outlay with General Revenue funding.

Justification

- This change level 5,000 for each year of the biennium is needed for maintenance and operation of the North West Campus. \$66,800 is requested for both years of the biennium. The North West Campus is now in operation. Additional funds will be necessary for the day to day operations of the facility. \$8,300 of Commitment Item 512:00:11, capital outlay is requested each year for additional office machines, office and household furnishings, audio-visual equipment, machinery and tools, and recreational and physical education equipment. \$1,500 of Commitment Item 505:00:09, training, is requested each year for staff members. \$500 of Commitment Item 506:00:10, professional fees, is requested each year. \$56,500 of Commitment Item 502:00:02, operations, is requested each year to operate the new facility. This change level \$75,000 for each year of the biennium is needed for maintenance and operation of the ALETA Campus. The North Dormitory was constructed in 1952 and also includes the kitchen, dining room and Administration section. The heating, cooling and plumbing are original; repairs are more frequent and more costly. Due to the age of our vehicle fleet, repairs cost will also escalate. This change level \$50,000 for each year of the biennium is needed to offset the increasing cost of food for basic and specialized students at ALETA. This change level \$280,000 for each year of the biennium is needed to accomplish ongoing goals at the Agency. (\$215,000) each year of the request is Commitment 11, capital outlay, (\$10,000) for replacement of capital equipment, 10 (ten) new training vehicles (\$205,000) each year, to be used on the Emergency Vehicle Obstacle Course, would decrease the training down time due to constant repairs. Currently there is 1 (one) vehicle the agency owns and 9 (nine) on loan from State Police. The first phase of the pursuit-driving track has been completed and is now in use. Basic students and veteran officers will need driver training. The Agency's records reflect that more than 80% of the approximate 11,572 Law Enforcement Officers in the state have no training in this area. Replacement of aging furniture, office, lawn, and kitchen equipment; (\$20,000) each year is anticipated. (\$45,000) of each year of the request is Commitment Item 502:00:02, Training Operations.
- DIS data and internet charges are required for AASIS, and data processing supplies are needed to maintain fiscal office. Wireless telephone needed for director when away from Academy. Operational costs for Northwest Training Academy for internet and e-mail services, telephones, cell phones and DP supplies. A computer scanner is requested for the Northwest Training Academy to provide necessary office equipment for training needs. \$65,000 in Commitment Item 506:00:10, Professional Fees, is requested each year to help collect and distribute data from the database. Many of these functions are still being handled manually. OIT will design a database program that will replace the existing database at ALETA and ACIC, providing faster access and capability to share information between Agencies. \$6,000 is needed each year of the biennium for data processing supplies. Network service and telecommunication will be used for internet and data charges, and for telephones and cell phones. \$115,000 in Commitment Item, Capital Outlay, is requested for FY 06 for the upgrade of the Fire Arms Training Simulator and related equipment. Equipment is used to train law enforcement officers throughout the state. \$10,025 in Commitment Item 02 is requested in FY 06 for the replacement of 2 scanners (\$600) and 2 printers (\$900.) Data processing supplies needed to maintain office \$4,025 for FY 06, and \$4,500 for FY 07. \$1,500 is needed each year of the biennium for DP equipment repairs and maintenance charges. Software/License is need for FY 06 for virus protection, currently \$3,982. Telephone and yearly domain charges are \$6,015 per year.
- C09 Executive recommendation includes CLIP reclassification of one Secretary I position (Grade 11) to Secretary II (Grade 13).
- C10 Request is to reclassify 1 position of Bldg/Equip Maintenance Repairman II, Grade 08 to Work Maintenance Leader, Grade 10; and to reclassify 1 position of Motor Vehicle Operator, Grade 10 to Shipping & Receiving Clerk, Grade 11.

Analysis of Budget Request

Appropriation / Program: D48 - Special Training-Cash

Funding Sources: 108 - Law Enforcement Standards and Training Cash

The Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training uses this cash appropriation for Operating Expenses and Capital Outlay associated with Special Training. Fees are collected from State Agencies for the use of the Training Academy's facilities for special training of their police officers and for meals purchased by the Fire Training Academy for students enrolled in training. The Commission uses this appropriation to buy uniforms up to \$40,000, purchases equipment and supplies, and for facility maintenance.

Change Level requests include Operating Expenses: \$250,000 each year of the biennium to pay SAU-Tech tuition for a 28-credit hour program awarded to all students that complete basic police training at either Camden or Springdale. Capital Outlay: \$31,325 for both years of the biennium for replacement of commercial kitchen equipment.

The Executive Recommendation provides for the Agency Request. Expenditure of appropriation is contingent upon available funding.
