



Southeast Arkansas Regional Planning Commission serves as the planning agency for Jefferson County and the cities the county encompasses. Currently only three cities (Pine Bluff, White Hall and Redfield) have zoning ordinances in effect. Therefore, the property located near the unincorporated community of Jefferson, Arkansas at the northeast corner of the interchange between Gravel Pit Road and I-530, more specifically described as follows:

which the corporation JCNSM Properties, LLC or assigns is planning to use for a medical marijuana cultivation facility as defined in Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016, is under no zoning requirements within this area of Jefferson County, Arkansas.

Thereby, JCNSM Properties, LLC is legally allowed to conduct business at that location as a medical cannabis business as long as it meets all State requirements.



SECTION E THE CHAIRMAN'S INTRODUCTION

As the Chairman and applicant for Natural State Medicinals Cultivation (NSM), I want to personally introduce you to our company by explaining our vision and story. Our group is formed entirely of medical and business professionals from the State of Arkansas. We are 100% locally owned with no plans of divesting. NSM is in no way a hidden partnership with outside investors subletting our professional accomplishments and Arkansas statehood. Our focus is on the cultivation and extraction of medical cannabis with zero members from our team applying for a dispensary license.

My background consists of 28 years in retail pharmacy. I was the President and CEO of the largest privately held pharmacy chain in the United States and headquartered in Pine Bluff, Arkansas. As President and CEO, I oversaw 157 pharmacies, over 500 pharmacists and 4,000 employees. Our company also owned and operated the largest wholesale pharmaceutical business in Arkansas, being licensed to distribute controlled substances in 32 states. The Committee has asked applicants to demonstrate experience in regulated industries and I have included a list of 1,302 licenses from my previous company, please see Exhibit 1 for this list. These range from DEA, pharmaceutical distribution, alcohol, tobacco, lottery and medical equipment across multiple states. I have never had a license suspended or revoked.

NSM's promise will be to provide our patients with the highest quality medical grade products specific for their medical condition in the most controlled, secure, and regulated manner possible. I have spent my entire professional career doing such. In addition, I am an owner and member of the Board of Directors of two steel building manufacturing companies.

Our Owners: I would like to provide you a snapshot of our team of owners and advisors. As stated earlier, we are all Arkansans having a combined 562 years of residency. Our ownership is 52% female and 25% minority. I also want to note that all equity is from invested capital on equal terms. No equity has been exchanged for services or products; only for invested capital. Our combined balance sheet represents a net worth of \$195m.

Owners from the medical community include a leading urologist and adjunct professor at the University of Arkansas for Medical Science with a focus on cancer, a renowned neurosurgeon, a neurologist specializing in epilepsy and ALS, a gastroenterologist with 24 years of service on the Arkansas State Medical Board, a dietitian, a PhD biomedical engineer and a veterinarian. NSM's six-member Medical Advisory Board owns 43% of the company. Furthermore, one of our owners has been working with software developers specializing in the cannabis industry for two years. He is licensed by Colorado to work in the spent great amounts of time working with Colorado's seed-to-sale platform and has been licensed by the state to do such.

From a business perspective our owners include the senior leadership of USA Drug, the previously mentioned retail pharmacy chain I headed, as well as the founder of the generic pharmaceutical distribution business. Collectively, we are the owners of a neurosurgery center, MRI imaging center, multiple medically focused IT businesses, a point-of-sale and security business, endoscopy center, outpatient surgery center, a specialty pharmacy, as well as a non-profit focused on aiding cancer survivors. From an agriculture perspective, our group owns an Arkansas produce wholesale distribution business and multiple farms totaling well over 1,000

acres and includes multiple owners of timberlands and wetlands. When objectively evaluating the ownership and leadership goals of the MMC, our team should meet and exceed the highest of expectations.

Our Advisors: A major focus for the successful implementation of Arkansas, Medical Marijuana program will be to establish both compliance and security. For compliance, we have retained the services of both a leading Arkansas attorney and a former U.S. Attorney as our third-party Director of Compliance. There will be ongoing, arms-length, quarterly compliance reviews. The only way to establish superior compliance and security is to engage an independent firm with no ownership or stake in the company.

Our Director of Security, a Marine Corps veteran, has an extensive career in both Arkansas law enforcement as well as a highly regulated business. He spent over 20 years as an Arkansas State Trooper prior to being elected as Sheriff of Grant County where he served two terms. At that time, the Arkansas Lottery Commission was newly formed and had a task very similar to that of the Arkansas Medical Marijuana Commission; the task being to run a highly regulated new business where security is paramount. He was the inaugural Director of Security for the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery. He was tasked with hiring and screening staff as well as the secure transportation of tickets, security, and maintaining the integrity of the program. Lance's long-time experience will be invaluable in establishing good working relationships with law enforcement officials on all levels throughout the state. We clearly have someone that has done this before. NSM is committed to ensure both the safety of our supply chain I headed as well as the safety of our employees. This has been clearly outlined in our security sections.

We aim to establish NSM as the leading producer and manufacturer of high grade, medical cannabis products ensuring the utmost in consistency and outcomes with our product mix. We are fully committed to ensuring that our business has the most proven and best practices for the medical cannabis industry, including but limited to: cutting-edge cultivation processes, pharmaceutically formulated manufactured products, and control measures, and best in class security protocols. We will be relying on three key individuals each with a specialized focus on the procedures, production, and research of medical cannabis in Arkansas.

Our general manager is a former Arkansas resident who became a 20-year senior executive at a Fortune 100, highly regulated beverage manufacturer. His vast experience in creating standard operating procedures (SOPs) has further translated into the cannabis cultivation vertical of the cannabis industry. He owns three best-in-class cultivation facilities in Denver while simultaneously holding positions on various cannabis industry boards.

Our cultivation manager will be relocating to Arkansas to supervise all aspects of the production of our product. His experience includes years of founding and operating legal cannabis cultivation facilities in Colorado. He has proven effective expertise in the execution of light spectrum, temperature, CO2, water levels, humidity, root development, and nutrient deployment for optimal cannabis production, quality control, and quality assurance. That is explained throughout our application and in detail in NSM's Exhibits. Every potential cultivator in Arkansas is seeking an out of state, experienced production and cultivation expert. I firmly believe we are importing the best one.

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In regards to plant research and genetics, our Director of Agriculture and Genetics is a native Arkansan, with a Ph.D. from the University of Arkansas in plant breeding and genetics. After graduation, he had a lengthy career with Monsanto overseeing the development of a global cotton-breeding pipeline between the U.S., India, and Brazil. He currently owns and operates a 400-acre produce farm in Arkansas.

Our process of growing is very “high touch.” We choose to manually complete key tasks that could be automated. The reason for this is we want to visually observe for the early stages of disease, pests, or underperforming strains. Moreover, our group uses a process of manual “schwazzing,” a process and term created by our Colorado advisors. In layman's terms, this is a highly detailed, proprietary defoliation process, similar to pinching back your tomato plants. It requires additional labor, but it is proven to increase key medicinal compounds, quality, and yields just like all of our cultivation and extraction processes. A beneficial side effect of this is the creation of more jobs for local Arkansans with our ultimate goal being the creation of the highest grade product.

State-of-the-Art Facility Design: Now I would like to briefly discuss the location, architecture, and design of our facility. We retained the services of [REDACTED], a nationwide architectural firm with extensive experience designing manufacturing facilities including those in the pharmaceutical industry. Our engineering firm from Colorado has extensive experience with designing superior cannabis production facilities.

We initially considered purchasing existing warehouse space to retrofit as a cultivation facility. However, we quickly decided against this, to construct a fully process- engineered, and expandable facility. Designing and building a cultivation facility from the ground-up is the only way to achieve a high-quality yield, maintain pristine growing conditions, and ensure the integrity and consistency of our cannabis genetics. While this choice does greatly increase the upfront costs of starting this business, we have found it to be absolutely necessary to achieve our internal goal of consistently manufacturing pharmaceutical-grade medical cannabis products within Arkansas.

Our design consists of smaller-sized cultivation rooms. Our advisors have developed this approach over the years and determined a smaller, [REDACTED] ft² room greatly increases the biochemical consistency as well as the individual quality of each plant. We are not taking a “sea of green” approach that leads to biological contamination, but rather a much more controlled method that lowers the price patients will pay for our product, increases the amount of pharmaceutical-grade cannabis produced, and eliminates any form of biological contamination.

We also believe it is critical to design not just for the short-term, but also have a plan in place for smart, future expansion. As will be illustrated later, our Phase I facility will be [REDACTED] ft². We have designed three phases with a potential growing capacity of [REDACTED] ft². I know as commissioners you have read of supply issues in other states. We want our facility to be well positioned to meet the growing demands of the State of Arkansas.

We understand that location is important in its effect on other Arkansans. It is safe to say that no individual or business would be excited about having a cultivation facility next door due to economic, political, social, sensory, or religious reasons. We are designing our building with the highest grade filtration system available, however, it would be impossible not to detect some

scent during a harvest. In order to have positive community relations, we have therefore chosen this remote location. This location is miles from almost any existing business, other than a waste management plant, which is nearly one mile away, and there are scarcely any residences within miles of our location. We chose to prevent any issues with neighbors up front, respecting the local communities of Arkansas rather than battling with them.

Research and Data Analysis: Another unique aspect to NSM is that to truly achieve our health care goal, we needed to develop a mechanism to address some of the unknowns in medical cannabis. There is not currently an efficient manner to track strain-specific outcomes nor is there a time-tested method to cross-check drug interactions with medical cannabis. Lastly, we are all keenly aware of the opiate addiction crisis occurring in the United States as well as in our home of Arkansas.



Community Impact and Sustainability: NSM is dedicated to benefiting the local community in which it operates as well as the state of Arkansas as a whole. Because of this core value to have a positive community impact, we will be locating our new facility in Jefferson County. We are all aware of the declining economy of Jefferson County and we are delighted to bring new, well-paying jobs and new revenue to such an underserved area. We are committed to providing not only well-paid positions, but long-term careers to the citizens of Jefferson County.

We will not be hiring anyone from outside of Arkansas to run or operate this facility other than our initial two medical cannabis advisors who will train everyone below them. When we sold our corporate headquarters in Pine Bluff, seeing the loss of jobs was excruciating. It will be very rewarding to help bring them back.

Furthermore, NSM has done extensive research on the qualifying conditions that are present in Jefferson County. Even though NSM will only be cultivating, extracting, and selling medical

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cannabis to licensed dispensaries in the state of Arkansas, NSM feels responsible for the well-being of the residents of Jefferson County. NSM discovered that Jefferson has higher rates of epilepsy within the state. NSM has chosen to allocate resources to ensure that several of the strains produced and manufactured products will specifically be for epileptic patients of Jefferson County.

NSM understands that the future is in sustainable cannabis production and business practices. As such, our company is preparing for the acquisition of a LEED certification. NSM wants to minimize negative impact on the local community and environment along with enhancing its positive impact. As a result, NSM will be employing USDA-certified-organic inputs and methodologies including innovative integrated pest management techniques that enhance plant immunology through environmental management, soil microbes, and symbiotic insects.

NSM wants to keep the Natural State, natural. We believe this starts with sustainable agriculture, environmentally smart building processes, and a philosophy that is dedicated to providing the highest quality medicine without any impurities to any immunologically compromised patients of Arkansas.

A Personal Note: I want to close with a testimonial from one of our owners and our Director of Communications. She lost her daughter to a lengthy battle with colon cancer. Like any parent, she left no stone unturned to try to bring her daughter comfort and relief. It was recommended that she try medical cannabis, something she previously would not allow in her household. Eventually, she decided to try it. It did not save her daughter's life, but it was unquestionably effective as an antiemetic and the increased appetite her daughter experienced greatly improved her quality of life. In closing, that is what we hope to do. We want to improve the quality of life for Arkansans with qualifying conditions for medical cannabis. Your service as a commissioner may seem like a thankless job, but you are definitely bettering the health of our state. Our team greatly appreciates your service and will certainly respect the tough decisions you are tasked to make.

SCHEDULE 1 - QUALIFICATIONS OF APPLICANT

Joe Courtright, P.D., R.Ph, Owner, Board of Directors Chairman: Joe has experience working in a *regulated field* - he began his pharmacy career in 1989 as a pharmacist for May's Drug Stores, Inc., ascending to Senior Vice President of Pharmacy and Information Technology. Joe most recently served as President and CEO of USA Drug, the largest privately-held pharmacy chain in the U.S. During his tenure, he oversaw 153 pharmacies, over 500 pharmacists, and 4,000 employees. USA Drug also owned and operated the largest wholesale pharmaceutical business in Arkansas with controlled substance distribution capability in 32 states. See Exhibit 1 for a list of 1,302 licenses from Joe's previous companies, ranging from DEA, pharmaceutical distribution, alcohol, tobacco, underground gas, eggs, Western Union, EBF, Class VII Liquefied Petroleum, lottery, to medical equipment across multiple states. Additionally the controlled substance distribution business and a subset of pharmacies required both *24/7 monitoring and armed security*.

In 2003, Joe designed and developed the first multi-location, multi-state, online *secure inventory tracking system* for pseudoephedrine and methamphetamine precursor products. Joe also implemented sound *financial and business planning* through the generation of 71 retail pharmacy acquisitions. He orchestrated the sale of the Memphis, TN market of USA Drug and

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Ike's Deep Discount to Walgreens. In 2010, Joe oversaw the redemption of certain shares of USA Drug which made USA Drug the largest privately-held pharmacy chain in the U.S. with a total valuation at purchase of \$214 million. In 2012, Joe orchestrated the sale of USA Drug and seven subsidiary companies to Walgreens with a total purchase price in excess of \$550 million, which represented a gain of approximately \$453 million and an IRR of 30.3%.

Joe is on the Board of Directors for KPH Healthcare, a national provider of pharmaceutical and health care services with complementary businesses in retail and commercial segments of these industries. The company is comprised of Kinney Drugs, with 100 full-service drug stores, Health Direct Institutional Pharmacy Services for long-term care needs, ProAct, Inc., a national pharmacy-benefit management company and mail order pharmacy, and Noble Health Services, a specialty pharmacy dispensing complex and chronic disease medications. KPH has annual revenue over \$1 billion and 3,000 employees.

Joe was on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Chain Drug Stores, representing drug stores totaling 40,000 pharmacies, 3.2 million employees including 178,000 pharmacists. Joe was also on the Board of Directors of Data-Rx, which provides pharmacy technology services in the United States. Joe is also a board member and owner of Associated Steel Group, which is a steel building *manufacturing* company with annual revenues of \$125 million. In 2017, Joe became the fifth recipient of the University of Kansas, School of Pharmacy Distinguished Service Award.

Terence Fitch, General Manager: Terence is a previous Arkansas resident and Fortune 100 company senior executive. While working as the President of the Western United States for Coca-Cola Enterprises, he managed and was responsible for 75 *manufacturing plants* and sales centers with over 7 million ft² of manufacturing space. Under his direction, his plants consistently scored at the top of the industry for efficiency, bottling over 6,000 Coca-Cola bottles per minute and manufacturing over 1,500,000 cases of Coca-Cola a day. He personally oversaw the distribution of each of those cases whereby he managed over 5,000 semi-trucks in 16 states.

As a senior executive, Terence also developed and executed numerous *business plans*. Under his leadership, annual sales grew to over \$4.2 billion, with seven regional vice-presidents directly reporting to him. These plans encompassed but were not limited to: go-to-market strategies, competition analysis, *regulatory compliance*, resource allocation, distribution, marketing, sales, and the annual budget with emphasis on examining returns on investment for repairs, maintenance, and expansion of new manufacturing plants, employees, and distribution pathways.

Additionally, Terence has experience in the *highly regulated cannabis cultivation industry* where he managed the operations of 3 cultivation facilities in Colorado with a combined annual production of 12,000 pounds of cannabis and over 65 employees. His experience in creating SOPs, managing sophisticated operations, and navigating complicated regulatory environments translates well into the cannabis cultivation industry. Terence has served on the Board of Directors of MassRoots since 2015, the premier publicly-traded social network for cannabis. Through this expansive experience, Terence also has experience with *secure Inventory Tracking and Control* and *operating a business with 24-7 security*.

Stephen LaFrance, Owner, Board of Directors: Stephen has experience in the highly *regulated industry* of pharmaceuticals. He joined USA Drug as owner and operator of 6 drug

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stores in 1993. Stephen developed the company's acquisition strategy to purchase and consolidate independent drug stores and small chains into the USA Drug family of companies. Prior to its sale to Walgreens in September 2012, USA Drug was the 6th largest drugstore chain in the United States as well as the largest privately owned pharmacy chain with 157 pharmacies.

Stephen founded the generic pharmaceutical distribution arm of SAJ distribution. That company owned and operated the largest wholesale distribution business in Arkansas with controlled substance distribution in 32 states. This *required DEA mandated 24-7 security, inventory tracking and control.*

In addition, Stephen was the founder, President, and CEO of six corporations which owned and operated 32 drug stores in five states, all separate from USA Drug. These stores produced over \$200 million in annual revenue. While orchestrating USA Drug's rapid growth, Stephen formed LAF Brothers Properties, LLC to manage commercial real estate investments. LAF Bros owns over 30 properties in seven different states. After the sale of the family business to Walgreens, Stephen formed a private wealth management office, Dale Capital Partners, Inc., with Stephen as a main Principal officer and owner. Having had P&L responsibility, Stephen has ample experience *creating and implementing sound business plans and financial plans.*

Stephen also has extensive experience in the field of *agriculture and horticulture.* He is the former owner and manager of Diantha West Farm which cultivated rice and soybeans on a 653 acre farm and AG Resource, LLC which cultivated wheat, rice, and soybeans. Stephen currently owns AG Resources II, LLC, which cultivates soybeans and wheat, and Yo Eleven Enterprises, LLC, which owns an investment in a company that grows trees in Sheridan, Arkansas.

Robert DeBin, Owner, VP IT and Business Development: Robert is an Arkansas native and cannabis industry IT expert. He graduated from the Walton College of Business with a degree in Entrepreneurship and Information Systems, also receiving a graduate certificate in SAP Enterprise Resource Planning. After graduating, he founded RockIT City Solutions, an IT services & consulting firm, specializing in payment processing and tablet *point of sale* systems for restaurants and retail stores, as well as networking, and security services. Robert is licensed with the Payment Card Industry Security Standards Council as a Qualified Integrator & Reseller.

After the passing of Colorado (CO) Amendment 64 his business pivoted, offering IT consulting services to the growing *cannabis industry* in CO. Robert holds CO's Marijuana Enforcement Division's Occupational Support License to legally work with cannabis manufacturers and retailers. He has worked with medical marijuana point-of-sale providers as well as advised dispensary operators and *cannabis cultivators* to help streamline their IT practices. While working in Colorado, Robert completed training in METRC, the first *all-regulatory*, seed-to-sale solution for cannabis. Over the past year, Robert has been working directly with our *cultivation* and *extraction* advisors in CO receiving hands-on training in their *cultivation, production, sales, security, and compliance* procedures. His experience and understanding of *point of sale* and *inventory tracking* with experience and training in *seed-to-sale tracking software* will help NSM establish best practices for compliance. Through this work he has also gained ample experience *creating and implementing sound business plans and financial plans.* Robert is a member of the Board of Directors for the Arkansas Cannabis Industry Association, a cannabis trade

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association advocating for laws, regulations and public policies that foster a healthy, professional and accountable medical cannabis industry in our state.

Andrew Salini, Cultivation Manager: Andrew is a Princeton University graduate with a strong background in creating *financial plans* as he was a strategist and portfolio manager from 2011-2014 at EMF, a fixed income hedge fund with \$500 million AUM. Andrew also worked for 5 years as an investment banker at Deutsche Bank and later Credit Suisse. He has experience with *developing and implementing business plans, secure inventory and tracking systems, and operating a business that requires 24-7 security and monitoring* as he oversees the operations of three *cannabis cultivation* facilities and four dispensaries in Colorado for High Country Healing, an industry leader both in Colorado and in the United States. High Country Healing has won numerous awards for its cultivated artisan cannabis using proven USDA organic methodologies. High Country Healing has consolidated annual revenues of \$10+ million. High Country Healing prides itself on being socially responsible and forward thinking with patient-friendly branding. More specifically, High Country Healing has created a color labeling program for specific chemotypes which will be used by NSM to further develop its own medicinal identification and classification program for patients in Arkansas. Andrew will be relocating to Arkansas to supervise all aspects of the production of our product. His experience includes years of founding and operating legal cannabis cultivation facilities in Colorado.

Dr. Scott Schlesinger, Owner, Medical Advisory Board of Directors: Dr. Scott Schlesinger has extensive experience working in a heavily *regulated industry* as he has practiced neurosurgery in Little Rock for over 25 years. Labeling of Medical Cannabis Products: NSM will exceed Arkansas's Department of Health Rules and Regulations, Section V. labeling guidelines, and our product labels will be printed in both English and Spanish. None of the packaging will be attractive to children, or show any insignia or brand that could mislead the customer. Labels will contain the required information

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for each product, with data furnished by the ERP. NSM will use a combination of printing labeling information directly on the packaging, well as printing labels to be applied to packaging and informational leaflets to be included with the products. Because patient health and safety is of the utmost importance to our company, NSM will adhere to, and exceed, the Department's rules and regulations governing medical cannabis labeling. Transport:**





Business Plan for Operating a Cultivation Facility:

Executive Summary: NSM’s powerhouse team includes “on-the-ground” knowledge and experience in the cannabis industry. Our management contains Fortune 500 business, medical cannabis cultivation, extraction, pharmacy, entrepreneurship, and knowledgeable medical professionals. Collective distribution, compliance, security, and business scaling experience will allow them to thrive in the cannabis industry. NSM believes in patient wellness via quality of life, and wishes to create economic development throughout Arkansas by generating tax revenue, jobs and careers for its residents. NSM’s business plan is based on the American Herbal Pharmacopoeia’s practices for cultivating cannabis and the pharmacy, agricultural, cannabis, business, and medical experience in its team. 



DONNA TERRELL

A personal tragedy is what drives Fox16's television news anchor Donna Terrell to seek involvement with medical marijuana in Arkansas.

In 2004 Donna's only child, Queah, was diagnosed with Stage III colon cancer at age of 27. Over the course of seven years, she battled the disease twice. Donna has often described the second bout as cancer that came back with a vengeance. But the mother and daughter remained optimistic hoping medicine and faith could help them win the fight a second time. Unfortunately, it was not meant to be.

During the last two years of Queah's life, Donna moved her daughter from Houston, Texas to Little Rock so that she could care for her. Because of cancer and its associated treatments and surgeries, Queah couldn't eat, and when she did eat she couldn't keep food down. It was eventually suggested that Queah could benefit from marijuana.

As Donna tells the story, "I don't smoke marijuana, I don't want people smoking it around me or in my home". But she was desperate and felt there was a chance her daughter could find comfort, so she allowed it in her home. Turns out, it was a positive experience for Queah. She developed an appetite, had less anxiety and her nausea was under control. Unfortunately, Donna's daughter could not continue smoking marijuana because they were unable to continuously obtain the drug. After exhausting every medical option they had, Queah was essentially skin and bones when she died on March 19, 2011. Donna has often said, "Cancer was a factor, but my daughter died from starvation. You could look at her and tell. Marijuana wouldn't have saved her, but she would have had a better quality of life".

Queah's death inspired Donna to draft a plan to help others, especially young people dealing with colon and other cancers. She was inspired by an experience her daughter had during chemotherapy treatments. Queah was introduced to yoga through a program at her hospital in Texas. Her mother remembers the phone call she received when her daughter first tried yoga and said it made her feel more at ease from the side effects of the drugs. That is the inspiration for 'Donna Terrell's Yoga Warriors Fighting Colon Cancer', a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization. Yoga Warriors is specifically designed to raise awareness and help survivors of all different kinds of cancer. Each year the organization has a community-wide, free event where hundreds of people come to learn the art of yoga, get information on leading a healthy lifestyle and becoming more aware of changes that may be happening in their bodies. Through donations, Yoga Warriors continues to successfully raise money each year to provide liquid nutritional supplements to cancer survivors needing financial assistance. It is also the brainchild and financier for free yoga classes for cancer survivors, patients and caregivers on the campus at the CARTI Cancer Center facility.

In addition to being an award winning news anchor and reporter for central Arkansas' Fox16 News at 5:30 p.m and 9 p.m, the 30-year television veteran also created a business model and launched her own company called Q-Impact, LLC. Through Q-Impact, she utilizes her skills in television news, marketing and different social media platforms. She is often asked to give

motivational speeches and emcee at various community events throughout the state. Donna has also performed duties for AETN, Arkansas' Public Television Station.

Community service and volunteering are also a passion for Donna. She has served on several executive boards for nonprofit groups; the most recent include Woman and Children First Domestic Violence Facility, Arkansas' Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation and Ronald McDonald House. She has also performed duties as an Ambassador for the American Cancer Society traveling to Washington DC to speak to congressional members to help shape policies regarding cancer issues.

Accolades

For her PhD she developed a non-invasive fetal heart-rate monitor (many of the HP monitors today employ her algorithms). She created the entire instrument from design and fabrication of the board to the assembly and programming. She used adaptive signal processing to remove the maternal cardiac complex exposing the entire fetal cardiac complex. While working on this project, she was invited to collaborate with several cardiologists at Harvard. Many NIH trials were run looking at both structural and functional outcomes in the fetus. The significance of this is that a fetus could be studied very early in the pregnancy without having to have the existing technology that required “the water to be broken” and a fetal scalp electrode applied (within 24 hours of delivery). She continued this research this research with her Post-Doc and followed up on many of these children after they were born. After her post-doc, she was offered a faculty position at The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the Department of Pediatrics. The Department is a partner of Arkansas Children’s Hospital. With her background she was fortunate to work on a diversity of projects. She worked with the “brain” group doing electro-physiologic studies on abused children with PTSD. She also worked with ACHRI Nutrition Center (one of a very few with Center status in the US) on a variety of childhood obesity outcomes-based interventions and prevention studies, as well as, failure-to-thrive children.

Over the course of her career, Dr. Mooney is fortunate to be part of an elite programmer group. She collaborates with many colleagues around the world and has been invited by several large EHR companies to participate in talks about the future and how technology can influence medicine. She has been invited to be a part of “beta” test groups for software / hardware / device certifications.

She specializes in integration and is working with several entities on new integration/ interface standards. She works with all type of groups to take data from multiple sources and make it useful and improve workflow efficiencies. “Connecting the dots” Dr. Mooney utilizes the many tools at her disposal to seamlessly integrate with other systems (from single users to Enterprise).

Dr. Mooney’s family runs a large produce company in Little Rock and Hot Springs. Regulations and certifications are abundant in this arena as it all deals with “Food Safety”. A requirement in this area is you must be able to track exactly where the food came from as well as where it’s current location is in the food chain. Because of “food-safety”, 24-hour surveillance is a big part of the check list and tracking algorithms. This controlled “Farm to Table” inventory control and tracking is very similar to the requirements for “Stem to Sale”. In addition to health department regulations, the FDA and USDA make frequent unannounced visits/audits. One of the main certifications from the USDA is Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) which is made up of seven divisions in the food chain. The bottom three deal with the farmers, the top 2 are comprised of grocery stores, etc. The produce company overlaps both of these groups (middle 4 levels). They deal with the local farmers (who have specialty and row-crop certifications) on a daily basis as well as the

industrial food brokers. They support “Arkansas Grown” every day and have a statewide distribution network (which has another set of regulations).

Medicine

In addition to the large medical-related regulatory body of work listed above, Dr. Mooney develops integrated solutions which move data bi-directionally between an application and the patient’s Electronic Health Record (EHR). She has also written complex certified medication prescription modules for Surescripts (the national prescription drug repository) and EHRs.

She is a partner in Bespoke Health Media, LLC and has developed a patient education application “MDspoke” which allows for targeted guidelines-based patient education (procedure, test, and medication education) by their physician. It also provides common FAQs and Informed Consent that become a part of the patient’s medical record.

Robert DeBin

Robert DeBin was born and raised in the Natural State. He attended high school at Little Rock Christian Academy, and after graduating in 2007 he went on to pursue his bachelor's degree at the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville. ERP systems track business resources—cash, raw materials, production capacity—and the status of business commitments: orders, purchase orders, and payroll. The applications that make up the system share data across various departments (manufacturing, purchasing, sales, accounting, etc.) that provide the data. ERP facilitates information flow between all business functions and manages connections to outside stakeholders. ERP systems give real time views of data that enable companies to address concerns proactively, drive improvements, and help to ensure compliance.

After graduating from college in 2011, while still interning at Agile Hub, Robert saw the need for a better solution for restaurant software systems. After some research, Robert decided to become a licensed distributor for the first iPad point of sale system designed for restaurants. In February 2013 Robert formed RockIT City Solutions, DBA CLU Solutions.

CLU Solutions paired the growing point of sale business with networking, audio/video solutions and payment processing. CLU joined an Independent Sales Office for a merchant services provider and began offering customers affordable payment processing services with the options to integrate into the point of sale. Robert became licensed with the Payment Card Industry (PCI) Security Standards Council (SSC) as Qualified Integrator and Reseller (QIR). The group is a multidisciplinary practice of neurology and neurosurgery specialists that diagnose and treat acute and chronic spine pain, Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia, ALS, severe spinal arthritis, Tourette's, Seizure disorders, Severe muscle spasm disorders including Torticollis and other surgical and medical disorders of the brain and spine. Their treatments include Botox injections, spinal injections for intractable acute and chronic spinal and nerve pain, spinal cord stimulators and spinal and brain surgery procedures for numerous disorders of pain and other neurological disorders.

His practice and surgery center employs and manages approximately 50 full time employees under the Center of Medicare Services (CMS) highly regulated federal "Conditions of Coverage" rules and treats approximately 3000 patients a year. They are responsible for extensive compliance programs and undergo repeated state and federal reviews including credentialing from the Department of Health and CMS every 2-4 years. He is responsible for extensive secure inventory tracking and control of medical supplies and medications including controlled substances at the surgical center. His business responsibilities as the CEO and CMO (Chief Medical Officer) at Legacy Surgery Center includes yearly budget and business planning and financial oversight that have to be submitted to state and federal agencies as part of accreditation and re-accreditation with the Arkansas Department of Health and CMS. After the May's and Med-X acquisitions, Stephen led the company's strategy to purchase independent pharmacies in the 6 states where USA Drug operated at the time: Arkansas, Kansas, Mississippi, Missouri, Oklahoma and Tennessee. Prior to its sale to Walgreens in September 2012, USA Drug was the 6th largest drug store chain in the United States, as well as the largest privately-owned pharmacy chain, with 157 total pharmacies.

After the sale of the family business to Walgreens, the LaFrance siblings formed a private wealth management office, Dale Capital Partners, Inc., with Stephen as a main Principal officer and owner.

Landscaping for internationally renowned architect David Levitt (3.) Trimming Cannabis all over the state of CO for Colorado Harvest Company (4.) Making Cannabis concentrates for the two largest medical dispensaries in Colorado as an independent contractor (5.) Solo operating 2 medium sized Cannabis gardens for a Colorado medical caregiver with 20 patients.








NATURAL STATE MEDICINAL - MEDICAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS






EXHIBIT 3.9 NSM ADDITIONAL HIRING CRITERIA

In order to be hired by NSM, all staff must be at least twenty-one (21) years of age and pass a recurring background check and reference check. Each staff member will provide proof of eligibility to work in the United States. Anyone whose criminal history check causes the individual to be unfit will not be hired, or will be let go (if a recurring background check identifies any current employee of having criminal activity). Only individuals who are highly qualified to perform their prospective job responsibilities are eligible for employment. The Human Resources Manager will ensure all employees meet required qualifications, experience, background, and educational credentials to carry out the duties of their assigned job. In accordance with RR 19.2, NSM will provide a prospective employee with a completed Notice of Intent to Hire form for submission to the Division. The prospective employee will not perform any duties until their Registry Identification Card has been issued by the Division.

Within 90 days of starting work for our facility, every employees will be required to take and pass the two-hour training course developed and administered by the Arkansas Department of Health. Employees who have not completed the required training within the initial 90-day period of employment will not be eligible to work until training has been successfully completed. As per RR 8.2, any employee, supervisor, or agent employed must have a current Registry Identification Card issued by the Arkansas Alcoholic Beverage Control Division on their person at all times while at the NSM cultivation facility.

General Manager- The General Manager will work with the Board of Directors, the Business Advisory Board, and the Medical Advisory Board to provide leadership in achieving NSM's vision, mission, strategy, and annual goals. The General Manager will work with and oversee NSM's personnel to grow the company, strengthen it, and ensure its continued sustainability. The General Manager will represent NSM as required, including attendance of important functions, industry events, and public meetings. Additional duties will include: working closely with the Controller to prepare annual budgets, complete risk analysis on potential investments, and advise the Board of Directors with regard to investment risk and return; working closely with the General Manager and Human Resources Manager regarding hiring practices, payroll and benefit disbursement; overseeing quality control throughout the company; and establishing goals for each department in partnership with the General Manager.

Terry Finch, General Manager - Terry is a seasoned corporate executive with over 30 years of marketing, sales, finance, manufacturing, supply chain, media, and supervisory experience in the highly-competitive and -regulated beverage industry. After obtaining his undergraduate degree in 1982 in marketing and finance from Arizona State University, Mr. Finch began his career as a management trainee in the beverage industry. He quickly rose through the ranks to lead Coca-Cola's overall operations in Arkansas. His vast experience in creating standard operating procedures (SOPs) has translated into the marijuana cultivation industry. Terry is the CEO of Super Farm, LLC, of Denver, Colorado, an operation that cultivates over 12,000 pounds of cannabis annually and employs over 65 people. Given his experience in both highly-regulated industries, he understands the utmost care must be taken to ensure consistency, quality, and safety each and every day with every product. His experience ideally qualifies him to lead this company as he is devoted to the cultivation, growth, and sale of medicinal marijuana. Throughout his career, Mr. Finch has shown the highest regard for operational and ethical responsibilities with leading organizations. He has experience in leadership and compliance; respect for governing bodies and regulations have driven his successful business career.

Controller - The Controller will provide operational and programmatic support to NSM. The Controller will directly assist the General Manager on strategic and tactical matters as they relate to budget management, cost benefit analysis, forecasting needs, and securing of new funding. The Controller will be responsible for overseeing day-to-day financial operations such as general bookkeeping, bank statement reconciliation, payroll tasks, and accounting. Additional duties will include: working closely with General Manager and Human Resources Manager regarding payroll and benefit disbursement; preparing and analyzing NSM's accounting records, financial statements, and other financial reports to assess accuracy, completeness, and compliance to reporting and procedural standards; and analyzing business operations, trends, costs, revenues, financial commitments, and obligations to project future revenues and expenses or provide advice. Medical Director - The Medical Director is an owner who will assist with developing procedures and processes to ensure NSM's operations are patient-focused, compliant with existing best medical practices and applicable regulations, and oversee development of training materials for employees. The Medical Director will work with the Medical Advisory Board and Business Advisory Board to develop patient and physician outreach and programming at NSM's Patient Resource Center, including patient education, substance abuse assistance, a referral program to other wellness services, and patient consultation protocols. The Medical Director, with input from the Medical Advisory Board, will also advise NSM on medicinally-appropriate product offerings and production methods.

Dr. Kelli Schlesinger, Owner, Medical Director - Dr. Schlesinger was born in Springdale, and attended the University of Arkansas. She earned her Medical Degree in Neurology, and offers specialized training in diagnosing, treating, and managing brain and nervous system disorders with an emphasis on patient comfort and care. Her special interests include neuromuscular disease and headache. She holds honors such as Excellence in Patient Care (2008), and Chief Resident in Neurology. She is currently a member of the American Medical Association (AMA), American Academy of Neurology (AAN), American Association of Neuromuscular and Electrodiagnostic Medicine (AANEM), and American Headache Society (AHS).

Joe Courtright, P.D., R.Ph, Chairman, Owner, Chairman of Board of Directors - Joe began his pharmacy career in 1989 as a pharmacist for May's Drug Stores, Inc., of Tulsa, Oklahoma, ascending to Senior Vice President of Pharmacy and Information Technology. Joe is a licensed pharmacist and former President and CEO of USA Drug, the largest privately-held pharmacy chain in the U. S., headquartered in Pine Bluff, Arkansas. Under his tenure, he oversaw 153 pharmacies, 500 pharmacists, and 4,000 employees. USA Drug operated the largest wholesale pharmaceutical business in Arkansas with controlled substance distribution capability in 32 states.

Joe is a member of the Board of Directors for KPH Healthcare in Syracuse, a national pharmaceutical and healthcare services provider with complementary businesses in retail and commercial segments of these industries. The company is comprised of Kinney Drugs, with 100 full-service drug stores in New York and Vermont; Health Direct Institutional Pharmacy Services for long-term care and alternative care needs; ProAct, Inc., a national pharmacy-benefit management company and mail order pharmacy; and Noble Health Services, a specialty pharmacy dispensing complex and chronic disease medications. KPH has annual revenue over \$1 billion and 3,000 employees.

Third Party Legal Advisor - The Legal Advisor will give accurate and timely counsel to the executive leadership team on Division regulations, labor law, and risk factors regarding business decisions and operations. The Legal Advisor will also review and evaluate compliance issues and concerns to ensure NSM is compliant with the rules set forth by the Department and all applicable state and local laws, regulations, ordinances, and other requirements.

Harry E. ("Bud") Cummins III, Third Party Compliance Officer - Bud Cummins is an attorney licensed in good standing in Arkansas since 1989. He graduated from the University of Arkansas in 1981 with a degree in finance and real estate, and earned his JD from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock (Bowen School of Law) in 1989. His law practice is Law Offices of Bud Cummins, PLC; Cummins served as a federal law clerk to a U.S. Magistrate Judge and to the Chief U.S. District Judge for the Eastern District of Arkansas. He was Chief Legal Counsel to Governor Mike Huckabee, and presidentially-appointed U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Arkansas from 2001 to 2006. Bud's private law practice specializes in compliance, internal investigations, litigation, and federal criminal defense.

Vice President IT & Business Development - Implements and oversees information and communications technology strategies of NSM. Responsibilities include ensuring a secure communications infrastructure that is HIPAA-compliant, reliable, strategically sound, and cost-efficient. This position will oversee programming voice and data telecommunications network circuits and equipment and computer systems networks, communication methods and devices, inventory tracking systems, alarm systems and surveillance systems. He/she will be responsible for ensuring the accuracy of all NSM inventory. Additional responsibilities include developing strategic communication plans; building and sustaining NSM's reputation for quality, reliability, and customer satisfaction; and overseeing the creation, maintenance, and continuous improvement of NSM's website, social media platforms, and business development processes.

Robert DeBin, Owner, VP IT and Business Development - Robert was born in Arkansas and attended the University of Arkansas. He has a graduate certificate in Enterprise Systems with a concentration in SAP Enterprise Resource Planning. Following college, Robert gained six years of experience configuring and implementing point of sale and inventory tracking systems for restaurants and retail stores. In February 2013, Robert formed RockIT City Solutions, DBA CLU Solutions. In April 2015, Robert partnered with a group out of Louisiana and began offering iPad based retail. In January of 2016, CLU began offering IT consulting services to the cannabis industry in Colorado. CLU has worked with medical marijuana point of sale providers and advised dispensary operators and cannabis cultivators to help streamline IT practices.

While working in Colorado, Robert completed METRC training (the first all regulatory, seed-to-sale solution for cannabis). METRC was deployed in December 2013 for the State of Colorado's Marijuana Enforcement Division, and supports marijuana regulations with technology to prevent and monitor drug diversions. The system has 20,000 users and has tracked

over 5,000,000 plants and 3,800,000 packages. Robert's deep understanding of point of sale and inventory tracking combined with experience and training in seed-to-sale tracking software will be a valuable resource for NSM, and help establish best practices for compliance.

Vice President Community Outreach - This position will work with the Medical Advisory and Business Advisory Boards to plan and market community outreach events, such as the substance abuse prevention program, community education sessions, physician education program, and the compassionate care program. He/she will conduct outreach to identify local community organizations with which to partner, working closely with NSM's Controller to ensure availability of necessary funding for NSM's outreach programs, develop required planning and reporting documents to qualify efforts, and spearhead programs. The CP of Community Outreach will continually engage local businesses owners and community organizations, as well as individuals, leaders, and organizers in the area to identify the community's needs and ensure our organization has a positive impact on the community. The VP will be responsible for government relations activities including monitoring local, state and federal legislation and regulations and reporting possible impact to the executive leadership team, and maintaining communication with state legislative and administrative officials (advising them as appropriate) of cannabis industry concerns.

Donna Terrell, Owner, VP Community Outreach - A personal tragedy is what drives Fox16's television news anchor Donna Terrell to seek involvement as NSM's Community Outreach Coordinator. Donna's daughter, Queah, lost her battle with colon cancer at age 29. Donna knows medical marijuana may not have saved her life, but would have greatly improved its quality. Queah's death inspired Donna to help other young people dealing with cancer. Queah was introduced to yoga through a program at her Texas hospital, and said it made her feel more at ease from side effects of traditional cancer drugs. Queah's experience is the inspiration for 'Donna Terrell's Yoga Warriors Fighting Colon Cancer', a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization. Yoga Warriors was designed to raise awareness and help all cancer survivors. Through donations, Yoga Warriors successfully raises money to provide liquid nutritional supplements to cancer survivors needing financial assistance. It is also the brainchild and financier for free yoga classes for cancer survivors, patients, and caregivers on the campus at the CARTI Cancer Center facility.

In addition to being an award-winning news anchor and reporter, the 30-year television veteran also created a business model and launched her own company called Q-Impact, LLC. Through Q-Impact, she utilizes her skills in television news, marketing, and different social media platforms. She is often asked to give motivational speeches and emcee at various community events throughout the state. Donna has also performed duties for AETN, Arkansas' Public Television Station. Community service and volunteering are a passion for Donna. She has served on several executive boards for nonprofit groups including Women and Children First Domestic Violence, Arkansas' Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation, and Ronald McDonald House. She has been an Ambassador for the American Cancer Society, traveling to Washington, D.C., to speak to congressional members and help shape cancer policies.

Director of Security - The Director of Security will oversee the installation and operation of security systems; ensure compliance with rules set forth by the Department and Division and all

applicable state and local laws, regulations, ordinances, and other requirements; and ensure safety measures for all cannabis products in transport are developed and followed. The Director of Security will work closely with managers to ensure employees are trained on and follow all NSM security SOPs. The Director of Security will oversee security officers, staff, and outside contractors to ensure compliance with NSM's security policies and procedures and all applicable laws and Department and Division regulations.

Lance Huey, Director of Security - Lance enlisted in the United States Marine Corps in 1983 and served for 7 years. He attained the rank of Sergeant (E-5) and was honorably discharged in 1990. Lance has an extensive career in Arkansas law enforcement and highly-regulated business. Lance spent over 20 years as an Arkansas State Trooper prior to being elected as Sheriff of Grant County for two terms. At that time, the Arkansas Lottery Commission was newly formed and had a task very similar to that of the Arkansas Medical Marijuana Commission. Lance was the inaugural Director of Security for the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery. He was tasked with hiring and screening of staff as well as secure transportation of tickets and all security and integrity of the program. Lance's long-time experience will be invaluable in establishing good working relationships with law enforcement officials throughout the state.

Human Resources Manager - The Human Resources Manager will be responsible for providing consultation to management and implementing strategic staffing plans, compensation, benefits, training and development, budget, and labor relations at the direction of the NSM executive leadership team. The Human Resources Manager will ensure employees are compliant with all personnel policies and training requirements.

Human Resource Manager - The hiring criteria for the Human Resource Manager includes a minimum of five (5) years experience in Human Resources positions, with two (2) of the five (5) years in a management level Human Resource position. He/She must have completed specialized training in employment law, compensation, organizational planning, organization development, employee relations, safety, training, and preventive labor relations (preferred). An active affiliation with appropriate Human Resources networks and organizations and ongoing community involvement and a Bachelor's degree or higher is a required.

Cultivation Manager - The Cultivation Manager (CM) will report directly to the General Manager. He/She will be responsible for supervising all phases of NSM's cultivation operations including: regulatory compliance, all cultivation phases, harvesting and curing of cannabis, quality assurance, and inventory control. The CM will work closely with the Laboratory Director and Laboratory Employees in strain identification and assessment of cannabis plants using DNA isolation methods and DNA processing. The CM will be responsible for micropropagation and tissue culture techniques, including genetic manipulation and genetic fidelity. The CM will ensure all employees follow Good Agricultural Practices and Good Handling Practices, and that crop records are maintained and retained properly. The CM will be responsible for keeping and protecting all inventory and ensuring accuracy of inventory in cultivation areas. This includes utilizing inventory tracking tools and overseeing compliance. The CM will ensure incoming materials for use in cultivation areas are receipted and managed appropriately, and when all

complete, cannabis is transferred to the processing areas following inventory transfer and chain of custody protocols

Andrew Salini, Cultivation Manager - Andrew is a Princeton graduate who oversees business operations of three cannabis cultivation facilities and four dispensaries in Colorado for High Country Healing, an industry leader in Colorado and the U S Andrew has a strong background in business development and finance as a portfolio manager for EMF, a fixed income hedge fund with a \$500 million AUM from 2011-2014. He has worked as an investment banker for Deutsche Bank and Credit Suisse. Andrew will be relocating to Arkansas to supervise all aspects of production of our product

Laboratory Manager - The Laboratory Director (LM) will directly report to the General Manager. He/She will be responsible for overall operation and administration of the laboratory, planning and directing quality assurance policies, and development, maintenance, and sanitation SOPs. The LM will direct and ensure appropriate testing systems in the laboratory; provide quality services in all aspects of test performance; ensure physical and environmental conditions of the laboratory are adequate and appropriate; ensure employee environment is safe from physical, chemical, and biological hazards; ensure safety and biohazard requirements are followed; and ensure Good Laboratory Practices are followed. The LM is responsible for keeping and protecting all lab inventory and ensuring its accuracy through consistent use of the inventory tracking system.

Josh Risley, Laboratory Manager - In June of 2015, Josh partnered to open Cannabis Maximus, a profitable, well-regarded, and licensed cannabis concentrate manufacturing company. The lab Josh and his team designed and built meets FDA clinical standards as well as achieving the pinnacle of OSHA safety compliance (Class I Division I); this ensures it will withstand the ever-tightening regulations around light hydrocarbon cannabis extractions. Because no other cannabis extraction labs in the world had been built to this standard, Cannabis Maximus pioneered the process for true Class I Division I cannabis extraction processing. Cannabis Maximus' manufacturing and sales operations began with practically no budget as a new and unknown brand. Within 8 months of opening operations, Cannabis Maximus consistently grosses between \$100,000 - \$120,000 of revenue every month, has grown from 5 to 20 employees, is sold in over 40 CO retail dispensary locations, and is recognized as one of the premier concentrate brands in Colorado

Sales Manager - This sales manager will directly report to the General Manager, and create and execute a sustainable, measurable medical cannabis sales and marketing strategy. He/She will work directly with the executive team to build critical relationships across the local cannabis concentrates industry, and execute strategies that achieve short- and long-term revenue goals. He/She will build and manage the call center for incoming sales inquiries and oversee inside sales. He/She will coordinate with the the VP of IT and Business Development regarding full implementation and functionality of the inventory tracking system to capture necessary information from sales. He/She will oversee the integration of the Inventory Tracking Tool with our ERP system to properly track product movement and inventory levels based upon sales

information. He/She will develop, train, and manage an Inside Sales team and establish commissions and territories/regions based growth of the business.

Marketing Strategy Manager - Ideal qualifications for this position include a minimum of five (5) years of business development, marketing, and sales experience, three (3) years of which are in the local cannabis concentrates industry. He/She must have excellent organization, communication, and presentation skills, and a demonstrated ability to effectively understand business strategy and vision. He/She must have familiarity with sales data analysis and reporting. This individual must have a Bachelor's degree in business or marketing, or a related field; a Master's degree is preferred.

Sales Representative - The two (2) Sales Representative positions will be directly overseen by the Sales Manager. As a team, they will aim to execute NSM's sales and marketing strategy. They will help build critical relationships across the local cannabis industry and execute strategies that achieve short- and long-term revenue goals. They will maintain a territory and assist with call center operations for incoming sales inquiries and fully utilize the Inventory Tracking and ERP Tools to capture necessary information from sales. Ideal qualifications for these positions include a minimum of three (3) years of business development, marketing, and sales experience; excellent organization, communication and presentation skills; a demonstrated ability to effectively understand business strategy and vision; familiarity with sales data analysis and reporting; and a Bachelor's degree in business, marketing, or a related field.

Supervisors - Supervisory positions are integral to NSM's operations. On the cultivation side, there will be three (3) Supervisors directly reporting to the Cultivation Manager. On the Extraction side, there will be one (1) Process Supervisor directly reporting to the Laboratory Manager. Cultivation Supervisors are responsible for supervising all phases of NSM's cultivation operations including: regulatory compliance, all phases of cultivation and production of cannabis products, quality assurance, inventory control, purchasing, and receiving of raw materials and supplies. On the extraction side, the Process Supervisor will work closely with the Laboratory Manager to implement, maintain, verify, validate, and continuously improve the overall Quality Systems and Food Safety (Safe Quality Food - SQF) programs for the facility, including HACCP¹, and Good Manufacturing Practices. Supervisors will directly oversee cultivation lead and support staff in their respective areas to ensure all employees are adequately trained in safe and sanitary methods of cultivating, processing, packaging, and labeling procedures in the production of NSM's cannabis products. They will be experts in operating the Inventory Tracking Tool and ERP, and train and oversee all subordinates to ensure quality controls.

Cultivation Employees - Cultivation Employees (CEs) include the roles of six (6) Leads and nine (9) Support Staff. These positions will be responsible for day-to-day cultivation tasks under the direct supervision of their Supervisor and will also be overseen by the Cultivation Manager. Cultivation employees will be involved in the all phases of NSM's cultivation operations


including room care, pest and environmental monitoring, pruning, watering, room turnover, sanitization, inventory tracking, manicuring, harvest, and curing. Cultivation Employees must have the ability to follow company SOPs related to growing, harvesting, inventory tracking, sanitation, and cross-contamination. They must operate, analyze, and troubleshoot complex digital machinery by following manufacturer's instructions. These positions require solid knowledge of medical cannabis cultivation and a demonstrated ability to keep records, take detailed notes, and report abnormalities to a Supervisor. A high school degree is required to hold positions as a Lead or Support; a college degree is preferred. Individuals holding a Lead position will demonstrate superior skills related to cultivating with an ability to oversee Support Staff with compliance to all SOPs.

Extraction Employees - Hiring qualifications of NSM's Extraction Employees (EEs) require at least five (5) years experience overseeing processing operations, preferably related to extraction of cannabis products for a Process Supervisor. EEs must have working knowledge of cannabis as a plant, including its chemical makeup, capability of being grown, refined/extracted, and the best methods for achieving a consistent product. These individuals must demonstrate the ability to enforce compliance with state and federal regulations with respect to the state board of health, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division and regulations for WPS and OSHA. EEs must have at least two years of extraction experience with specific experience in tracking and recording tasks, utilizing an Inventory Tracking System, and a Bachelor's degree in agriculture, biology, botany, chemistry, or a related field of study.


Process Employees - Process Employees (PEs) will consist of two (2) Process Leads and two (2) Support positions. PEs will be directly supervised by the Process Supervisor and overseen by the Laboratory Manager. They will be responsible for testing and analysis for potency and safety and working with Cultivation Employees (CEs) to identify genetic markers. Laboratory Employees (LEs) will conduct internal cannabis testing during the curing phase, holding stage, and after packaging and labeling as directed by the Laboratory Manager. They will maintain strict adherence to all applicable SOPs and maintain consistency with all inventory tracking processes. All PEs must have two (2) years experience in a horticultural or agricultural environment with intermediate math skills, calculations understanding, and demonstrated ability to keep proper records and report abnormalities to the lab manager. A high school degree is required to hold this position; a college degree is preferred. The two (2) Process Leads will possess superior skills, experience, and/or education and demonstrated ability to oversee Support Staff with compliance to all laboratory responsibilities.

Security Officers - Security Officers (SOs) will be responsible for implementing and suggesting improvements to NSM security procedures, authorizing entrance and departure from NSM's facility, and other duties assigned by the Director of Security. SOs must have at least three (3) years experience in law enforcement, security or loss prevention. Experience in de-escalation and non-violent problem resolution will be highly desired. They must be comfortable sitting or standing for long periods of time; a high school diploma is required for this role.

EXHIBIT 3.11 NSM TIMELINE









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
